What to Wear:

Guests featured on the 10 Burning Questions segment often wear outfits that reflect their personality. The recommended attire for this conversation should be a casual Dodgers-branded shirt instead of business clothes to create a relaxed, light-hearted tone.

Anticipated Topics of Discussion:

- Life after baseball
- Passions and projects outside of baseball
- Top memories from career
- Questions about family

Tips to Consider:

- Share short and to the point stories rather than longer explanations
- Try to bring humor into the conversation to make it more of a genuine conversation throughout the interview. This will make it more engaging for the audience and for both Kershaw and Verducci.
- Discuss the impact of Kershaw's Challenge when it comes up
- This segment is meant to feel conversational and fun, speak from your heart.
- Mention what you'll miss most about baseball
- Talk about defining moments in your career
- End on a positive note, express your new excitement/ plans in retirement
- Speak about people who played a big role in your career

TOUGH Q&A

With growing discussion about the uncertainty of Major League Baseball's upcoming seasons, including debates over a possible salary cap and concerns about a potential work stoppage, it is important to be prepared for related questions and how to address them. Bellow are sample questions to use as references.

Potential Questions & Recommended Responses:

- The upcoming season is at risk of cancellation because owners and players have not agreed on salary cap terms. How realistic is this?
 - The current situation has a lot of tension around it. Both sides understand progress must be made to see a future of MLB. Everyone involved knows the importance and are committed to keep baseball strong.
- Do you side more with the players or owners in this debate?
 - I don't pick sides. Players and owners both care about the game, they also need each other for this sport to work. All I want is for everyone to figure it out and find a balanced compromise.
